How Your Personal Information is Used

Possible Consequences

The results of a certified criminal record check can have consequences that can affect you personally. Some of the consequences may include being denied entry into Canada or a foreign country, or being denied permanent residency or citizenship.

Use of Personal Information

Your personal information will be used by governments in Canada, private companies, and other bodies that you authorize for security and reliability screening.

Fingerprints taken under the authority of the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* are used for immigration admission purposes.

If you are a person of interest or involved in a criminal investigation, your personal information may be shared with the investigating agency.

Personal information banks (PIB) [RCMP PPU 005](#) and [RCMP PPU 030](#) provide detailed information about how the RCMP collects, uses, discloses, retains, and/or disposes of information provided for certified criminal record check applications. These PIBs also provide other information not related to civil applications.

You are giving consent to CCRTIS to update your criminal record (if you have one) with any new name that you provide on your certified criminal record check application.

You are giving consent to CCRTIS to notify the relevant police agency of any new information that you may have provided on your certified criminal record check application (e.g. new name, new address).

The personal information you provide on your certified criminal record check application is protected under the *Privacy Act*. You have the right to the protection of, access to, and correction of personal information. Your personal information is searched and disclosed in accordance with Canadian law, including the *Privacy Act*, *Criminal Records Act*, *Youth Criminal Justice Act*, and the *Ministerial directive concerning the release of criminal record information by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police*. In some cases, personal information may be disclosed without your consent in accordance with subsection 8(2) of the *Privacy Act*. In addition, the CCRTIS [Dissemination of Criminal Record Information](#) policy governs the use of the Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC) system for police services that conduct criminal record checks.

You have the right to file a complaint with the Privacy Commissioner of Canada if you think your personal information has been handled improperly. You may file a report with the [Privacy Commissioner of Canada](#).

Criminal Record Information

If you have been fingerprinted under the *Identification of Criminals Act* and/or the *DNA Identification Act* and have been charged and subsequently convicted, you likely have a criminal record on file at CCRTIS' National Repository of Criminal Records and/or applicable local police databases. If you have been charged but not convicted, you may have non-conviction information on file at CCRTIS' National Repository of Criminal Records and/or applicable local police databases.

Fingerprint Destruction

CCRTIS is not authorized to keep the fingerprints you provided for this application. CCRTIS destroys fingerprint submissions after the application is processed and they are not further used or added to RCMP systems.

Delivery of Your Results

CCRTIS issues one product and only allows for one method of delivery per application submission.

The processing of your application can take 3 to 120 business days, depending on whether manual intervention is required, if there is a match to a criminal record, and/or if CCRTIS has to clarify parts of the application with the submitting agency.

Unless otherwise directed, you may choose to receive your certified criminal record check by post via Canada Post. The use of Canada Post's delivery service may present certain risks including but not limited to:

- Some privacy risks exist when using postal services.
- CCRTIS is not responsible for information loss due to Canada Post's technical failures, mishandling, damage or delay in the delivery of results, or if an invalid or incorrect return address was provided.
- There is no expedited service delivery available.

In some cases, you can authorize CCRTIS to send the results of your criminal record check to a third party (e.g. Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada, agency, lawyer, friend). You must complete a third-party consent form; however, this means that you will not receive a copy of your results from the RCMP.

For the FAST (Free and Secure Trade) program, the RCMP sends your criminal record search result in an electronic format directly to the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA).

Your Consent

Please read carefully and check each box indicating your consent.

I authorize CCRTIS to use the information on my certified criminal record check application to search the Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC) system and the National Repository of Criminal Records in accordance with federal laws and RCMP policy.

I give consent to CCRTIS to release my criminal convictions, and where authorized, charges before the courts, findings of guilt, and non-conviction information in the National Repository of Criminal Records, and any other information concerning my criminal history accessible in the Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC) system.

I understand that I may contact CCRTIS at CCRTIS-SCICTR@rcmp-grc.gc.ca to withdraw my consent but that withdrawal may not be possible depending on the status of my certified criminal record check application.

I understand that by not providing my consent, I cannot continue with my application and I will not receive a certified criminal record check.

I have read and understand the contents of this document and acknowledge that the information set out by me in this consent form and any supporting documentation is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
